Then there's the 4 year old who came from another country. Her mom brought her to the library to read with us after having been introduced to us around town. After reading, we talked about other programs that might interest the youngster. Mom started bringing her to a variety of programs and, not only did the youngster make friends, so did Mom!

A 4th grader moved to town to live with her Grandmother. The child was withdrawn and had some difficulty handling situations. When she came to the library, she quickly became friends with Jasmine. She took her for a walk around the room, showing her books. She took Jasmine to a corner and read to her softly. And then, she just talked quietly to Jasmine. Grandmother said that this was the first time since she'd arrived that the youngster had opened up and trusted.

The Library is a vehicle to open up the community to new residents!
