MEETING PATRON NEEDS

The staff of Round Lake Library has worked hard to meet patron needs. Most titles which appear on the *New York Times* bestseller list are available at the Library. Popular new titles are often (even usually) available in the Library on the same day that they appear on bookstore shelves. Staff also tracks the use of popular materials and additional copies are added when needed. What does this mean to our patrons? It means that waiting times for popular items are reduced. It means that new items are available to anyone who visits our libraries, with none of the residency restrictions that town residents have found so frustrating in the past at other libraries. It means that we listen to your requests and add titles whenever possible.

To illustrate our commitment to customer service, let's look at one of the most popular books of 2009, *The Help*, by Kathryn Stockett. The Library began with one copy of the book. As waiting lists grew, we added more copies, until the number of combined copies available at both libraries is now seven. In addition, we purchased the book in large print and also as an audio book. If that sounds like a lot of copies, it is, but here are the number of times those items have been used: the regular book circulated 123 times, or more than 17 times per copy. The large print title was borrowed 5 times ,and the audio book was borrowed 16 times! More than 160 Round Lake Library patrons borrowed this title in one year!

Obviously not every book is that popular, nor can the library budget accommodate multiple purchases of every title, but the purchase and use of materials exemplify how the Round Lake Library serves its patrons. Other interesting facts:

- The Library dramatically increased the number of books available in large print format at both locations. In fact, the number was more than doubled! This was thanks in part to donations from the Lions Club.
- The Library added 23 downloadable e-book titles to SALON, the library system's e-book site.
- Our youngest patrons are finding more books just for them at the libraries, too. The Library almost doubled the number of board books (the heavy, thick-paged books) for toddlers. The Library will continue to add sturdier, hardcover picture books, as well, to meet the demand of young readers.
- Teen collections have increased by 50% this past year, as well. The development of a teen book club has increased interest in the book collection, too.
- Staff has replaced battered copies of perennial favorites and classics in the adult collection as well, especially at Clark House.
- DVD collections have been greatly expanded in both buildings and new titles are continually added as they are released.

The Board and staff are committed to providing quality library service to our patrons. Stop in and see for yourself the additions we have made. If you have requests or suggestions, please let us know.






The Tuesday Evening Book Club, moderated by Charlene Durham, will be reading *The Forgotten Garden*, a novel by Kate Morton.


