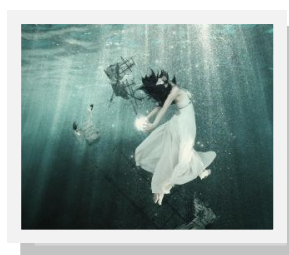

The Final Detail by Harlan Coben

This book is one in a series by Coben featuring Myron Bolitar and Windsor Horne Lockwood III. Myron cuts short his Caribbean vacation when he learns that Esperanza, his friend and partner, has been arrested for the murder of a client. Myron investigates the murder and needs Win's expert help to stay alive. The Bolitar/Lockwood series is fast paced, written with humor plus twists and turns to the plot. Coben is one of the best writers of the action thriller mystery.

In the witty, occasionally absurdist tradition of P.G. Wodehouse (Jeeves and Wooster), author Simonson introduces Major Pettigrew, who is juggling several crises; all of which are testing his patience. Through the Major's eyes we discover his surprise and delight at the ease with which he becomes acquainted with the widow Mrs. Ali, the only shopkeeper in a small English village filled with eccentric characters. The characters made me laugh out loud and I enjoyed having Major Pettigrew's occasionally blundering, occasionally panicked perspectives. You may figure out the beginning and the end, but the trip is one you shouldn't miss.

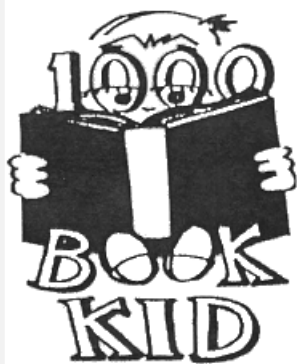

The Light Between Oceans by M.L. Stedman

After four harrowing years on the western Front, Tom Sherbourne returns to Australia and takes a job as the lighthouse keeper on Janus Rock, nearly half a day's journey from the coast. To this isolated island, where the supply boat comes once a season, Tom brings a young, bold, and loving wife, Isabel. Years later, after two miscarriages and one stillbirth, the grieving Isabel hears a baby's cry on the wind. A boat has washed up onshore carrying a dead man and a living baby. Tom, who keeps meticulous records and whose moral principles have withstood a horrific war, wants to report the man and infant immediately. But Isabel insists the baby is a "gift from God", and against Tom's judgment, they claim her as their own and name her Lucy. When she is two, Tom and Isabel return to the mainland and are reminded that there are people in the world. Their choice has devastated one of them.

children's books

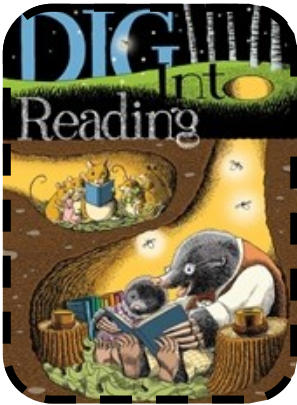
2. Inform the library staff that this is a 1000 Book Kid. The 10 books will be placed in a special bag with the receipt listing the books and due date.
